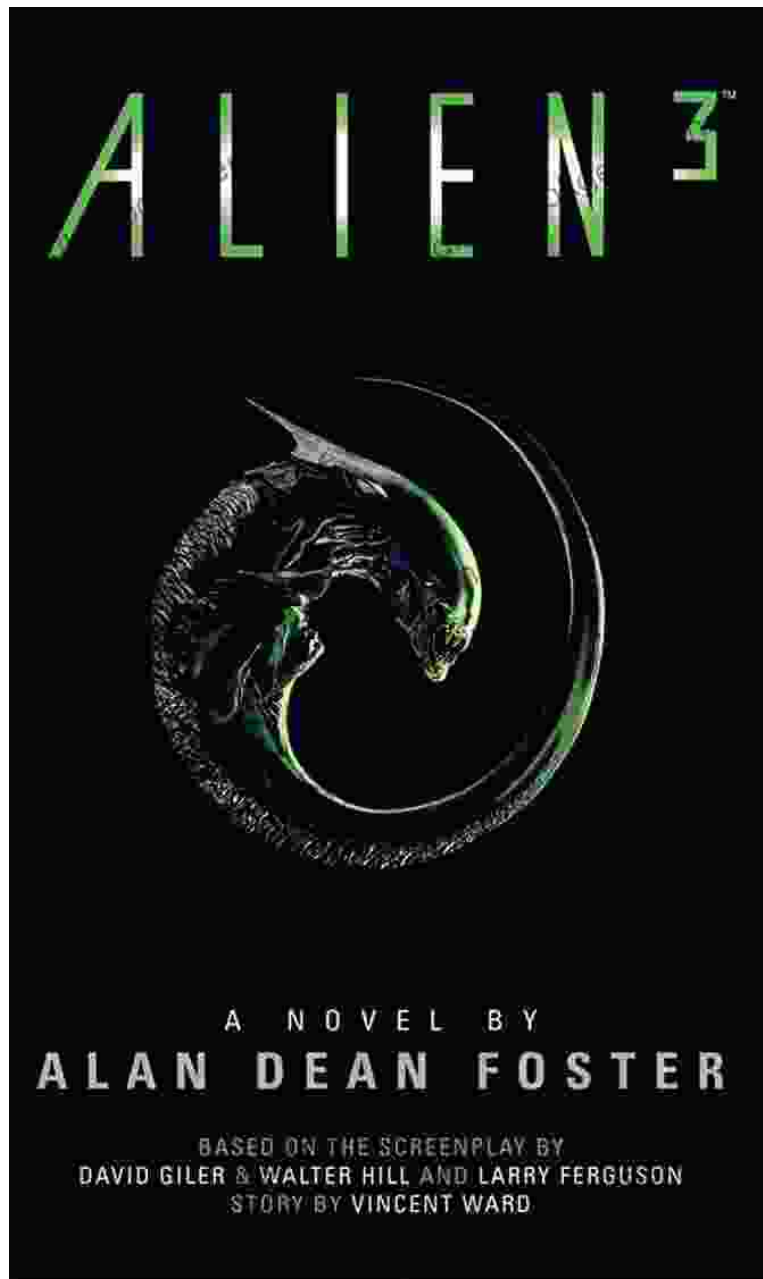


Alien: The Official Movie Novelization - A Terrifying Literary Encounter with the Xenomorph

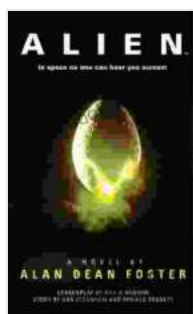
Writing Style

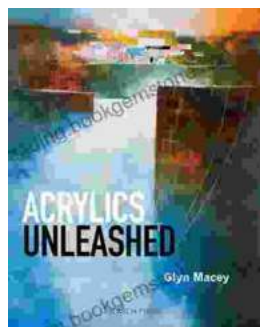
