

There was a strong sense of safety and belonging in Kahala. We felt comfortable playing outside until the streetlights came on and could always count on our neighbors to look out for us.


Nostalgia and Reflections

Kahala will always hold a special place in my heart. It is a place where I learned the value of friendship, adventure, and community. It is a place that I will always cherish and return to with fond memories.




